Solar Battery Saver Panel - to keep the two boat batteries fully charged between use. \$74 each

Tubes of Make-a-Gasket - regular and thin gasket material so Joe can make gaskets when he doesn't have one available. \$5.00 per tube

Ballast for fluorescent lights -for both single and 2-tube 4 ft lights to replace ballasts

in library lights.

One manual set of boat trim tabs - these go on the bottom of the boat to make for a smoother ride. \$25

20 sturdy chairs for library - perhaps your church or school is purchasing new chairs. These could be folding chairs as long as they are durable.

Bench mounted drill press - for Joe's work shop.

Boxes of shop rags - Scotts Rags in a Box of 300 cost approx. \$10.

Gas lawn mower - not self-powered, no grass catcher.

2 Rotary Hand Pumps - to pump fuel out of 55 gal drums. \$30 each

NEW GENERATOR ON THE WAY TO LAGONAVE

Our WISH supporters have once again responded to the urgent need to provide necessary equipment for mission operations. You demonstrated that all things are possible when we join together in service to the Lord.

Contributions totaling \$2,000 have purchased a new 100kw generator which will provide a reliable source of electricity.

A 20 ft sea container will be loaded in St. Louis for shipment to Haiti the first week of January. In addition to the new generator, the container will be filled with more waterline pipe to reroute the line damaged by the huge rock slide this summer. Joe will also receive a new hydraulic dump trailer and numerous miscellaneous supplies to assist him with mission operations. See details of our scavenger hunt below.
